

Flow (CFS)	Description
< 250	Ideal for wading all sections of river, very difficult for floating
250-500	Still good wading all section of river – floating is difficult
500-750	Wading is good but water begins to push, use caution - Good floating
750-1000	Wading is difficult and limited to certain sections – Ideal floating, great conditions for surface action
1000-1400	Wading is very difficult and limited to banks- Ideal floating and surface action remains consistent
1400-1800	Wading not recommended, limited to bank – Perfect for floating, surface action is fair, good streamer/bugger conditions.
1800-2200	River becomes very big, swift and deep. Upper limit to good fishing by floating. Rapids change from class 2 to class 3
>2200	Stay home and tie flies or fish the tribs
